

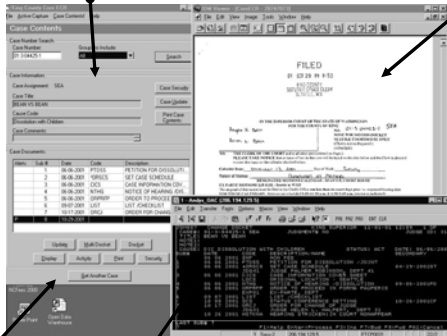

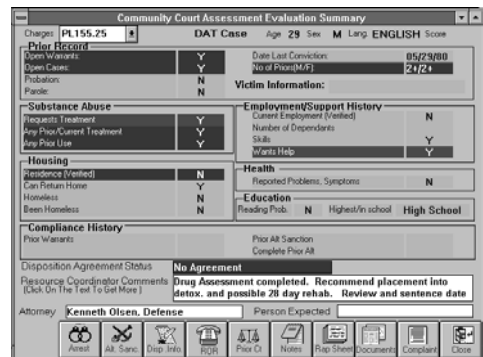
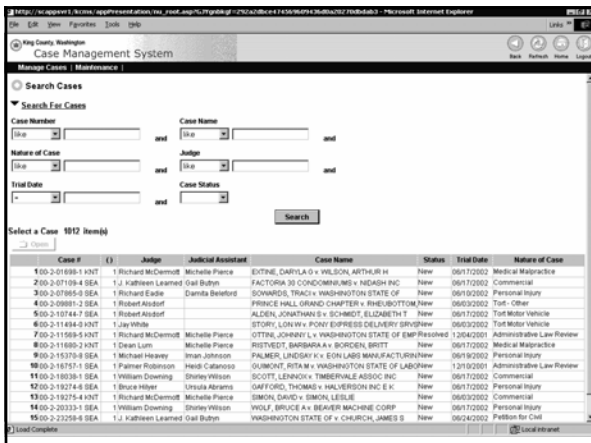
- Better information equals better justice

Case Contents Window Document Viewer Window



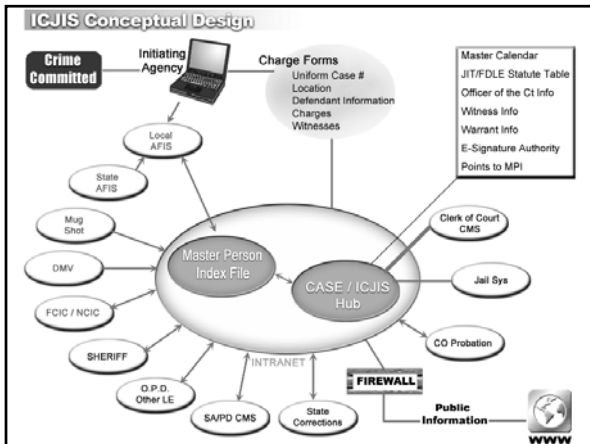
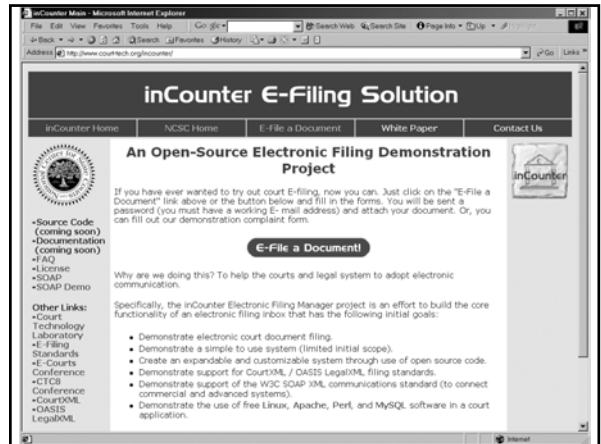

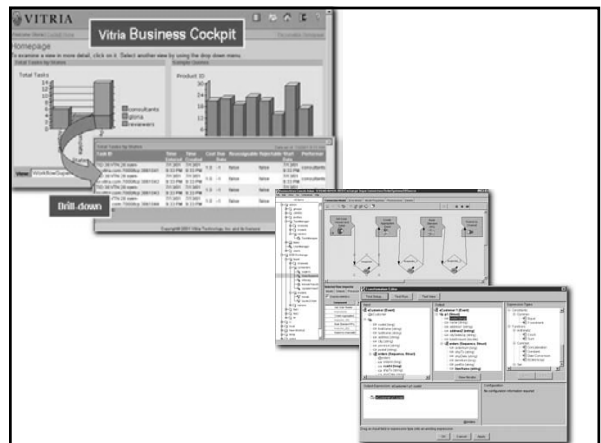
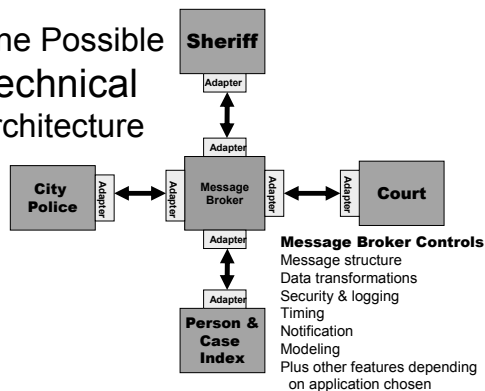
- Currently Civil Cases Only

- If it's a report – then share it on web site

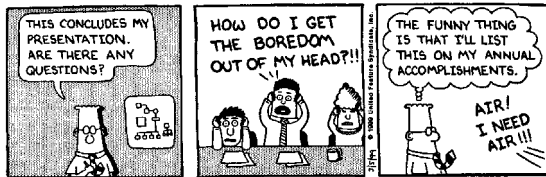
One Possible Technical Architecture
